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INFORMATION ON APPLYING FOR IMMEDIATE ADMISSION (DUE TO PERSONAL HARDSHIPS)

Any study placement that is granted as part of the quota for placements due to personal hardships is no longer available in the pool of other placements for other quota categories.

Cases of personal hardship must be reviewed extremely carefully in order to prevent a violation of the right to equality under the law as enshrined in Germany's Basic Law in the event that the case is not actually substantiated by the circumstances.

Please note:

- An application for immediate admission is only possibly for students planning on starting their first semester of study in a program with restricted admissions.
- If the application for admission due to personal hardship is rejected, then students can still apply through the regular application process.
- Furnishing proof of a severe disability alone does not constitute sufficient evidence for hardship cases.

Requirements for the medical specialist's report

- 1. The medical specialist's report must sufficiently comment on the individual criteria mentioned in the application request;
- 2. The medical specialist's report is required to be written in German. Otherwise, a translation into German has to be provided. Only a sworn translator or an institution authorized to produce translations for official purposes can provide the translation;
- 3. It must be no more than one year old;
- 4. The report should include information on the origin, severity, and course of the illness or disability, as well as a prognosis of the condition's future progression;
- 5. The report should focus on the individual condition and its specific course and prognosis. It should not be a general description of the applicant's health;
- 6. The report should also be written in a way that is understandable to laypeople;
- 7. Additional supporting documents might include, for example, the applicant's disability identification card or the official notification from the public assistance office.

What are some factors that are generally not accepted as grounds for immediate admission? (examples)

In the following examples, an application will generally be rejected unless other extenuating circumstances can be proven.

Unsubstantiated applications concerning special health conditions or disabilities:

- If the applicant is tied to a specific location due to home care and support for an existing condition.
- If the applicant had to stop their previous studies or professional occupation due to an illness, but the waiting period can be spent doing something else.
- Limited career options due to illness, but the waiting period can be spent doing something else.
- Desire to start a degree program as a means of compensating for mental illness.

Unsubstantiated applications concerning special social conditions or family situations:

- You are married or have a child/children or are an orphan/half-orphan.
- A family member is ill, severely disabled, unable to work, or reliant on a caretaker.
- You will surpass an important age limit if you don't start your studies soon; for example, the age limit for the preparatory phase of teacher training or to be appointed a civil servant (Beamt*innen).
- Limited financial support for studies.
- One or both parents are Spätaussiedler*innen (ethnic German immigrants), expellees, politically or ethnically persecuted persons, or refugees from former East Germany (GDR).
- If you stopped studying or working due to unemployment, poor job prospects, a lack of motivation or aptitude, or out of personal convictions/conscience; you started a degree program abroad but can't complete it there and therefore wish to do so here.
- It was a struggle to obtain a university entrance certificate through second-chance education.
- If you gave up a promising career in order to pursue second-chance education, and now you are worried that when you return to that career, your professional training and knowledge will be out of date due to rapid changes in the field.
- A connection through family relations to the place where you wish to study.
- Performing a voluntary service.

Unsubstantiated applications concerning early admission

- The applicant was previously admitted to their first choice of degree program; however, they did not enroll because their higher education entrance qualification was not valid.
- The applicant gave up their study placement because they couldn't find a place to live.
