
Know Your Rights About Rules and Regulations

You have to take up your studies – but what does that mean?

- Do I have to register for courses, show up regularly and be active in class?
- How many credit points do I have to complete each semester?



Bachelor 180 credits



Master 120 credits

Credits points (cp) according to the European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS)

1 cp = approximately 30 hours workload (presence at courses, reading, learning ...)


Know Your Rights About Rules and Regulations

How much time do I have in total?

- In Germany, only one in five Bachelor's degrees is completed in the standard period of study
- Freie Universität Berlin does not limit the duration of study
- However, student visas and residency permits may have different requirements; for questions about visa renewals and related regulations, please contact the FU Pass Service
- Scholarships, loans, and BAföG may only be offered for a limited period of time or number of semesters

Re-Taking Exams / Number of attempts

- You do not feel ready for an exam? → Usually it is possible to de-register from an exam during a specific time period.
- You have at least 3 attempts for every exam, and 2 attempts for your bachelor's and master's thesis.

Feel free to visit lectures of other degree programs, Affiner Bereich (= credits in other degree programs),
 Nebenhörer*innenschaft (= auditing at other universities in Berlin/Brandenburg)

Self-organization is the key

- Acquire knowledge of where to find answers (see the before-mentioned online guide)
- Do not hesitate to ask questions, also to professors (don't wait too long)
- Check out workshops offered across the campus (such as workshops offered by the Center for Academic Advising and Psychological Counseling as well as the Career Service)
- Take tours offered at the university libraries and enjoy the wide range of resources available







Multifactor-Authentication (MFA)

- Multi-factor authentication is required to log in to the my.FU portal.
 In addition to your password, a second authentication method must be set up.
- ➤ The FUB IT Service will send you a code matrix for the initial setup, which can be converted to another method (the Authenticator app is recommended).

Please set up MFA immediately after receiving the code matrix and keep the code matrix in a safe space!


Example of a Code-Matrix

Re-Registration

- In order to continue studying in the next semester
- Paying the semester fees, in rare cases further criteria (see Self-Service section of the my.FU portal)
- Late re-registration (between July 19 and September 30)
 causes a late fee of 19.94 Euro

Deadline: 13/02/2026

(always until the last Friday of the lecture period)



By mid-January there will be a notification at the Self Services area in your Zedat portal saying "Vorläufig ausgeschlossen", which is **to be ignored!**





How do I put together my course schedule?

The first point of reference for putting together your course schedule are the study and examination regulations of your subject (or subjects). There you can find an exemplary study course plan that serves as a non-binding suggestion for how to plan your studies. Moreover, they also include descriptions of the modules you have to take throughout the semesters. You are not really sure what "modules" are exactly? Find out more at the "Modules and credit points"-section of this Online Study Assistant.

After finding out which module or components of a module you have to take in a semester, the next step is to take a look at the course catalogue. It lists all the courses that are offered in the respective semester and gives you information on what the course will be about, who is teaching it, and the time and place. Sometimes you have the option to choose from several courses. The course catalogue will give you more information on that if that is the case.

The actual registration for courses takes place on Campus Management. You can find all relevant information about that at the "How do I register for classes"-section of this OSA.


Information on Exams


- When choosing a module, you are automatically considered for the exam that usually takes place at the end of the semester. But taking this exam is not **binding** unless you see this symbol:
- ➤ Depending on your degree program, you either have three or four attempts for every exam (exception: bachelor's and master's thesis with usually only two attempts).
- ➤ Usually, modules can or have to be completed over the course of two (or more) semesters. Don't worry if you don't complete everything all at once.



























E-Learning: Blackboard
